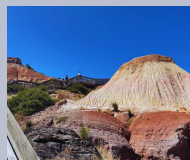

Waite Conservation Reserve Loop

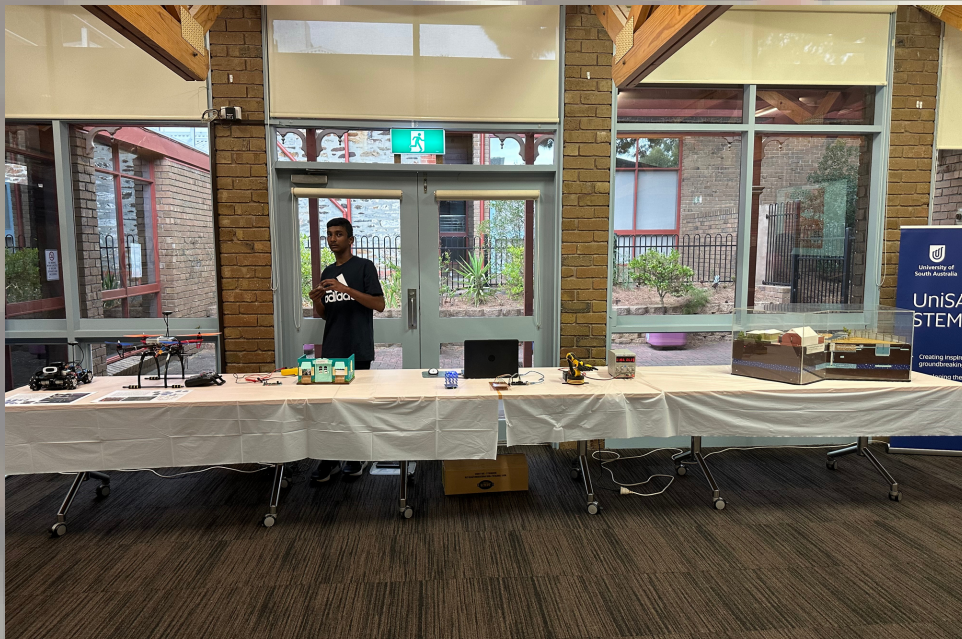

Pizza Lunch for New Uni Students

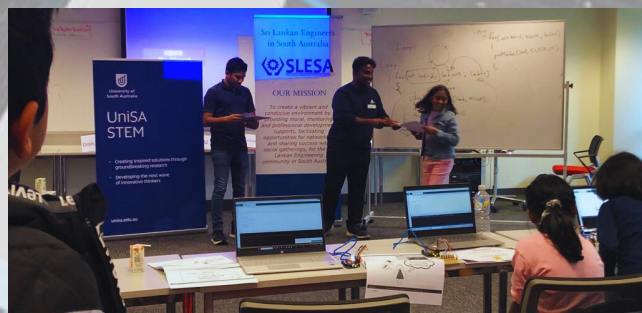


